## **COLD-WEATHER INFORMATION**

Recesses will be outdoors unless outdoor temperatures fall below -20°C (including windchill) then, in accordance with Board policy & guidelines, OLOP students will have indoor recess. Please ensure that your child(ren) have appropriate clothing to enjoy our Canadian winter! Students should come to school with boots, hats, mittens/gloves and proper outerwear, such as snowpants and a winter jacket. We also encourage parents to send an extra pair of socks, pants and mittens/gloves, which can be kept in your child(ren)'s backpack or cubby, in case they get wet during outdoor recess. **Please remember** 



to label your child(ren)'s belongings so if they are misplaced, they can be returned to their rightful owner! Also, a reminder that students who are not well enough to play outdoors during nutritional breaks should remain at home until they feel well enough to participate in a full school day.

## **ALLERGY ALERT**

Just a reminder that we are a peanut/tree nut safe school. We have students and staff with severe, life-threatening allergies to peanuts and tree nuts. Also, please note that the use of peanut butter substitutes (e.g., Wow Butter) is not permitted as it is difficult for staff to monitor and may cause anxiety for those with a life-threatening allergy. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in helping to keep ALL of our kids safe!

## **VOLUNTEERING**

If you are wishing to volunteer in the school, for a class trip, etc., please ensure that you have an up-to-date police check and/or declaration. If you are unsure, please contact the office. We also kindly ask that, police checks are submitted to the office at least 3 days prior to an event (i.e., trip) taking place. This ensures adequate time for it to be processed.



## **Immunizations (December 2023)**

In Ontario, as per the <u>Immunization of School Pupils Act</u>, 1990 (ISPA), all students between the age of 4-17 must provide proof of routine childhood immunization with Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis, Polio, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Meningitis, and Varicella (for children born in 2010 and after), or have a valid exemption, in order to attend school. This information is used to help protect students and the public in case there is a vaccine preventable disease outbreak in our community. The Health Unit is mandated to enforce ISPA and assess the immunization status of children in accordance with the <u>Immunization for Children in Schools and Licensed Child Care Settings Protocol</u>, 2018.

Each year, the Brant County Health Unit assesses the immunization records of students around the age of 7 and the age of 17 to ensure students are compliant with immunization requirements. Students who fail to provide proof of immunization, or a valid exemption, may be suspended from school for up to 20 school days. This year (2023–2024 school year) the focused cohorts are the following birth years: 2006, 2007, 2014, 2015, and 2016. The suspension period for elementary students will begin in March 2024.
