PROGRESS REPORTS

ANAPHYLAXIS ALLERGY ALERT

Our Lady of Providence is a Peanut/Tee Nut Safe School! At OLOP, we have several students and staff with severe risk allergies to peanuts and tree nuts. As a Catholic School community, and in accordance with Sabrina's Law (2005), we ask your co-operation in helping us ensure that all students are in a safe and healthy environment by reading all labels and packing lunches and



snacks that are free of these items. Truly, this is a life saving measure. If other caregivers prepare your child(ren)'s lunches and snacks, please share this information with them.

Please note that the use of peanut butter substitutes (e.g., WOW Butter, etc.) is **NOT** permitted. The reasoning behind this is that these substitutes look and smell like peanut butter, which makes it difficult for staff to monitor as well as possibly causing anxiety for students and staff with a severe allergy.

While it is impossible to create a risk free environment, students, parents, and staff can all take important steps to minimize potentially fatal allergic reactions. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping ALL of our students safe!

HALLOWEEN



On Tuesday, October 31st, students and staff will have the opportunity to wear their costumes or dress in black and/or orange for the day. The day is meant to provide a safe and fun experience for everyone, therefore costumes should reflect our Catholic values and beliefs and not reflect violence, excessive gore, blood or anything inappropriate or derogatory. For safety reasons, props such as swords or any "look alike" weapons are **NOT** permitted.

It is also recommended that students not bring accessories such as wands, tiaras, etc., as these items may be broken or lost in transit.

We will continue the tradition of our costume parade throughout the school community beginning at 9:30 AM (weather permitting). This will also be a nutrition exempt day. Students can bring in snacks and as usual **MUST** ensure that their snacks are peanut/tree nut free. A balance of healthy snacks and treats is always encouraged! Individual teachers will communicate special treat requests for their own classrooms.



SCHOOL CASH ONLINE

As of September 2019, for safety and efficiency reasons, we will solely be utilizing School Cash Online as the **ONLY** method of payment for field trips, hot lunches, student items, etc. School Cash is a convenient, safe and secure means to pay for these events/items. If you haven't done so already, please register at School Cash Online for this easy to use service. Here's how:

- Step 1: Please go our school's website or to: https://bhncdsb.schoolcashonline.com
- **Step 2:** Register by selecting the "Get Started Now" and follow the steps.

Step 3: After you receive the confirmation email, please select the 'click here' option, sign in and add each of your children to your household account.

You can register using a debit card or, new this year, credit card. Ample communication for field trips, hot lunches, school events, etc. will be provided via notes, classroom newsletters, classroom calendars, school newsletters, school website postings, and at least 2 automated e-mails from SchoolCash. On average, events will be open for two weeks (including weekends) for payment to be made through School Cash.

ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION
